Topic – Christmas

Literacy and Communication and Language

We hope you will agree the children gave a fantastic performance on Thursday evening at Brentwood Cathedral and we congratulate them all, superstars! We hope you had a very enjoyable evening and we thank you for supporting the children at this special school event. As we near the end of our first term, the children have been great learners and are ready for a well-earned rest. First, they have a very important letter to write! In our English lessons this week, we will be writing to Father Christmas in the hope that our wishes will come true. We will be practising our sentence writing and thinking about how we write a letter. Our phonics lessons continue, consolidating all of the sounds we have learnt, reading and spelling the 'tricky words' and we will be encouraging to write independently. Keep writing Reception, you are doing great!



Maths

In our Maths lessons, we continued to use Numicon to solve simple addition and subtraction number problems. We even used 'Santa's sleigh' to help us with our 'take away' number sentences as each present was delivered and the number of presents became smaller, less. We learnt how to record our number sentences, thinking about the minus and equals sign and what they mean. We continue to count carefully and some of us are getting better at writing our numbers, remembering to write them the correct way round. Next week, we will be working with the children to see if they can recognise and correctly sequence numbers to 20 if they are presented with them in a random order.

Suggestions of ways you can support your reception child with the EYFS curriculum:

Continue to practise the sounds and 'tricky words' that have previously been sent home for homework and carry on reading and blending sounds together. Allow your child to have a go at reading signs, food packets, labels and anything that allows them to apply their sound knowledge. Encourage your children to write independently, Christmas lists, cards and gift labels. A Christmas wish list is a perfect example of writing for a purpose! Go on a number hunt around the house, spot the number then write it down, who can collect the most numbers? A simple Bingo game is always good fun and helps with number recognition.

Extra information:

We are still finding scarves and hats that are not labelled and this proves very difficult to match them to the correct owner! Please, please ensure all new uniform items are labelled. P.E kits and coats will be sent home at the end of the final week for a freshen-up but must be returned on the first day of school. Please take this opportunity to check that all kit still fits and your child has plimsolls in their P.E bag that they haven't outgrown as they grow so fast! As we near the end of our first term, we would like to thank parents and the wonderful children for a fantastic start to the year. English

Throughout this week, we have completed the following reading activities:

- Considering the particular characteristics of nonfiction/information texts.
- Giving well-structured descriptions and explanations of different toys from non-fiction/information texts.
- Showing an understanding of word meanings from nonfiction/information texts about toys.
- Using the non-fiction/information texts provided to find information in response to direct questions about toys.


Next week, we will be completing activities with a writing focus. Over the course of the week, we will be covering the following skills:

- Participating in a presentation about a toy of their choice.
- Reading writing to check that what is written makes sense.
- Writing down ideas or key words about a toy of their choice.
- Using adjectives to describe toys.
- Writing a non-fiction narrative about a toy of their choice.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's English:

Remind your child that a dictionary is a book or electronic resource that lists words in alphabetical order and gives their meaning. If possible, model how to use a dictionary and work with your child to find the meaning of different words.







Maths

This week, we have developed our knowledge and understanding of number and place value. We covered the following learning objectives this week:

- Counting to and across 50, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number.
- Ordering numbers up to 50 and saying one more and one less.
- Using the language one more and one less in practical situations.
- Identifying and representing numbers as pictures.

Next week, we will be focusing on measurement. Over the course of the week, we will be comparing, describing and ordering objects based on their:

- Length and height, e.g. which is shorter? Which is taller?
- Mass and weight, e.g. which is lighter? Which is heavier?
- Capacity and volume, e.g. full, empty, quarter full, half full, etc.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

Discuss the meaning of the terms 'one more' and 'one less' with your child. Remind them that the number that is one more is the number that comes after the given number and the number that is one less is the number that comes before it. Encourage your child to say the number that is one more and then one less than a variety of numbers up to 50.

Extra information: (This could include: trips, notices to parents, school initiatives, class events)
Year 1 really enjoyed rehearsing for the Christmas concert earlier this week, in particular trying on their animal headbands!



Next week in art, we will be using paint and glue to assemble and decorate an autumn wreath. Please could your child bring an apron or old oversized shirt to school with them to ensure the paint and glue does not stain their uniform.

As you're aware, recently the weather has turned a lot colder. With this in mind, please could you ensure your child has their school coat brought in with them during the winter months.

English

This week, Year 2 continued to look at non-fiction. We returned to the theme of wolves looking at the books 'Wolves' by Emily Gravett and 'Beware of Boys' by Tony Blundell.

Our objectives covered were:

- Recognising the structure of non-fiction books
- Identifying sequences of events.
- Making predictions

Over the next week, we will be continuing our topic of nonfiction, focussing on writing instructions. Over the course of the week, we will be covering the following skills:

- producing a written piece for a purpose, maintaining form
- using when/ if/ but to subordinate clauses

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's English:

Reading is a very important skill in year 2. Try to read a variety of text types – particularly non-fiction books. Ask them questions about their reading.

Please ensure all children read regularly at home – thank you.



Maths

This week, we looked at shape and patterns. We covered the following learning objectives this week:

- Can I recognize and name 3D shapes?
 - Children named various 3D shapes
- Can I identify 2D shapes on the surface of 3D shapes?
 - Children recognized that the faces of shapes were 2D shapes
- Can I order and arrange patterns and sequences?
 - Children identified and continued different sequences and patterns.

Next week, we will be looking at data handling. We will interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts and block diagrams.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

Children should practise their times tables, 2, 5 and 10x particularly. They should also practise doubling and halving up to 20 and number bonds to 10 and 20.

Extra information: (This could include: trips, notices to parents, school initiatives, class events)
Please could you ensure your child has a coat with them in school as they still go outside in this wet weather to play.

On the same note, the children need PE thermals or a tracksuit so that they can be warm when doing outdoor PE. Thank you for your help in this matter.

Please could you send in an Art apron or old shirt so that the children can take part in painting and other messy activities? Please note that they will be unable to participate without this.



Maths

Next week we will be using all of our knowledge learnt across the term to carry out problem solving challenges.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

The children have worked hard in Maths this term and have learnt a lot! Using all of the objectives covered, see if the children can explain to you a 'real life' situation when these Maths skills will be useful.
