




Year group: Reception


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Literacy and Communication and Language

This week we celebrated our amazing dads! We made cards, collages and decorated a tea coaster that was kindly donated by our PTA. The children also used their developing writing skills to write about their dads and the special times they spend with them and the wonderful things they do. Next week we will return to our topic and read the story of The Rainbow Fish. We will sequence events of the story and then write our own story.



Maths

In our Maths lessons, we continued to secure our one less skills and then looked at subtraction. Some of us recorded our subtraction number sentences. Next week we will focus on estimating and addition. We will use a number line to add and begin to record our number sentences.

Suggestions of ways you can support your Reception child with the EYFS curriculum:

Practise estimation skills during every day activities around the house and use objects to add and subtract. Continue to read and question the children about what they have read. It is important for them to understand what they have read and for them to understand new vocabulary.

For our school trip, children will visit the Sealife centre wearing their school uniform, school cardigan or jumper if it is cooler weather and if we expect rain, we will take the children's Oakfields' school coat. English

This week we completed the following writing activity alongside reading comprehension, grammar and punctuation quizzes:

Recording a recount of the Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole workshop.

Next week we will be completing writing activities based on the story 'The Day the Crayons Quit' by Drew Daywalt and Oliver Jeffers. Over the course of the week, we will be covering the following skills:

- Re-reading and making simple changes to their writing.
- Attending to and building on the contributions of others.
- Using adjectives to describe the things the crayons can draw.
- Planning and recording a letter to a crayon from Duncan.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's English:

Select a crayon from the story. Can you remember the reason why they wrote a letter to Duncan? Begin to brainstorm ideas in relation to how you could persuade the crayon to return if you were Duncan.

Maths

This week, we have developed our knowledge and understanding of time alongside completing maths quizzes. We covered the following learning objectives this week:

- Naming the seasons.
- Naming and sequencing the days of the week.
- Naming and sequencing the months of the year.

Next week, we will be focusing on addition. Over the course of the week, we will be covering the following skills:

- Using the language of: more than, less than and equal to (mental maths).
- Solving addition number sentences (using jumps on a blank number line, partitioning or column addition method).
- Solving addition number problems (using jumps on a blank number line, partitioning or column addition method).

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

Solve addition number sentences using the jumps on a blank number line method. Remember to record the first number in the number sentence at the start of the blank number line and record the correct number of big (tens) and little (ones) jumps to represent the second number in the number sentence.



English

This week, Year 2 continued their topic of persuasive speech. We spent time thinking carefully about how we persuade people.

We covered the following skills:

- Participating in debates and discussions
- Writing about real events

Next week, we will continue our topic of persuasive speech. We will continue to read and discuss some persuasive writing. We will look at skills such as:

- Understands the different structures of non-fiction texts
- Locates specific information on a given page in response to a direct question

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's English:

Reading is a very important skill in year 2. Try to read a variety of text types – particularly non-fiction and poetry books. Ask them questions about their reading to check their understanding. Please ensure all children read regularly at home – thank you.



Maths

This week, we looked at measures, particularly adding amounts of money and finding change. We covered learning objectives such as:

- Can I read scales?
- Can I add amounts of money?
- Can I solve problems involving the addition and subtraction of money?

Next week, we will continue to study measurement. We will be able to:

- Tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes
- Solve problems involving intervals of time

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

Children should practise their times tables, 2, 5 and 10x particularly. Once these are secure, move onto the 3x and 4x. They should also practise doubling and halving up to 20 and number bonds to 10 and 20. Don't forget to practise real life maths with your child – weighing and measuring, position and direction and telling the time. It all helps!

Extra information: (This could include: trips, notices to parents, school initiatives, class events)


The attendance for the week before half term was 94.4%. This is below the necessary 96%. Let's try to improve!




English

Maths

This week we have been looking at decimals the children have looked at :

- comparing numbers with two decimal places.
- solved simple measure and money problems involving fractions and deciamls.

Next week the children will continue to look at measurement. They will be converting between different units of measure and estimating, comparing and calculating different measures.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

Please look around the home or outside for when measurement is used in everyday life. We had a great discussion this week about how decimals and fractions are used.

- S&L Can I verbally structure a for and against argument?
- Language Can I use connectives to structure and organise ideas within a paragraph?
- Grammar Can I use commas for clauses?
- Teacher Led Can I use supporting reasons to back up a main idea?

Next week, we will be looking at writing a description of a setting. We will be using varied sentence openers, descriptive expanded noun phrases, a range of conjunctions and advanced punctuation.
