#### This week in class:



In between learning the Christmas songs, the children have taken part in lots of lovely Winter and Christmas themed activities. The children have had the opportunity to explore making their own Christmas trees using green playdough, painting magical snowy pictures using white glittery paint and even cut out the letters of their name in the shape of snowballs! Whilst all these lovely activities have been going on the children have continued to practise their Phonic sounds and recap the 4 sounds we have been taught so far.











#### Word of the week

**Frozen** – As part of our Winter theme this week we have been discussing the word frozen with the children and what it means. We have explored blocks of ice and discussed how ice is made and what happens when it melts.

## Understanding the World

#### **Literacy and Communication and Language**



Our first Christmas concert is fast approaching and the children have been working hard to remember their lines and singing the many joyous Christmas songs that accompany our yuletide performance. We hope they keep on practising and we are sure they will deliver perfect performances! As we near the end of our first term, the children have been great learners and are ready for a well-earned rest. First, they had a very important letter to write! In our English lessons this week, we have been writing to Father Christmas in the hope that our wishes will come true. We have been practising our sentence writing and thinking about how we write a letter and special messages. Our phonics lessons continue, consolidating all of the sounds we have learnt, reading and spelling the 'tricky words' and we will be encouraging the children to write independently. Keep writing Reception, you are doing great!

#### Maths



In our Maths lessons, we continued counting and ordering, testing our knowledge on shape, space and measure and we have also made 'wrapping paper' using shapes in a repeating pattern. The children were encouraged to talk about the shapes they used, discussing properties such as number of sides and corners (vertices). We continue to count objects carefully, pointing to each object and saying the number name and some of us are getting better at writing our numbers, remembering to write them the correct way round. Next week, we will be working with the children to see if they can recognise and correctly sequence numbers to 20 if they are presented with them in a random order.

Suggestions of ways you can support your reception child with the EYFS curriculum:

Continue to practise the sounds and 'tricky words' that have previously been sent home for homework and carry on reading and blending sounds together. Allow your child to have a go at reading signs, food packets, labels and anything that allows them to apply their sound knowledge. Encourage your children to write independently, Christmas lists, cards and gift labels. A Christmas wish list is a perfect example of writing for a purpose! Go on a number hunt around the house, spot the number then write it down, who can collect the most numbers? A simple Bingo game is always good fun and helps with number recognition.

#### Extra information:

We hope to see many of you at our Reception Christmas play on Monday and Tuesday and we hope you have all sent your ticket requests back to your class teachers.

We are still finding scarves, gloves and hats that are not labelled and this proves very difficult to match them to the correct owner! Please, please ensure all new uniform items are labelled. P.E kits and coats will be sent home at the end of the final week for a freshen-up but must be returned on the first day of school. Please take this opportunity to check that all kit still fits and your child has plimsolls in their P.E bag that they haven't outgrown as they grow so fast!

As we near the end of our first term, we would like to thank parents and the wonderful children for a fantastic start to the year. #### **English**

Throughout this week, we have completed the following reading activities:

- Considering the particular characteristics of nonfiction/information texts.
- Giving well-structured descriptions and explanations of different toys from non-fiction/information texts.
- Showing an understanding of word meanings from nonfiction/information texts about toys.
- Using the non-fiction/information texts provided to find information in response to direct questions about toys.


Next week, we will be completing activities with a writing focus. Over the course of the week, we will be covering the following skills:

- Participating in a presentation about a toy of their choice.
- Reading writing to check that what is written makes sense.
- Writing down ideas or key words about a toy of their choice.
- Writing expanded noun phrases to describe toys.
- Writing a non-fiction narrative about a toy of their choice.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's English:

Remind your child that a dictionary is a book or electronic resource that lists words in alphabetical order and gives their meaning. If possible, model how to use a dictionary and work with your child to find the meaning of different words.







#### Maths

This week, we have developed our knowledge and understanding of number and place value. We covered the following learning objectives this week:

- Counting to and across 50, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number.
- Ordering numbers up to 50 and saying one more and one less.
- Using the language one more and one less in practical situations.
- Identifying and representing numbers as pictures.

Next week, we will be focusing on measurement. Over the course of the week, we will be comparing, describing and ordering objects based on their:

- Length and height, e.g. which is shorter? Which is taller?
- Mass and weight, e.g. which is lighter? Which is heavier?

The children will then solve problems relating to measurement.

#### Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

Discuss the meaning of the terms 'one more' and 'one less' with your child. Remind them that the number that is one more is the number that comes after the given number and the number that is one less is the number that comes before it. Encourage your child to say the number that is one more and then one less than a variety of numbers up to 50.





#### **English & Maths**

**English** - This week, we have covered the following reading activities:

- Making inferences from a text.
- Reading questions and identifying key words.
- Reading the text and identifying key words.

Next week, we will revisit our comprehension skills. We will use our skills from the last week to help us identify key words in the questions. Towards the end of the week the children will independently answer comprehension questions.

**Maths** - This week, we have focused on money. We covered the following learning objectives:

- Recognising the coins, we use and say how much each coin is worth.
- Combing coins to make a value.
- Using different coins to make the same amount of money.
- Solving missing money problems.
- Solving problems involving giving change.

Next week, we will revisit the four operations. We will recap the different strategies the children can use. Towards the end of the week the children will independently solve a range of number sentences. They must be able to identify the appropriate strategy based on the numbers.



#### D&T

On Wednesday the children designed their lunchboxes for the reindeers. As a class we discussed the different compartments that they might need to include. The children have lots of ideas about the types of food they wanted their lunchbox to store. Which resulted in lots of unique deigns. On Thursday afternoon, the children made their lunchboxes. We used a range of materials. The children worked really hard and tried their best to stick to the designs. We hope you are as amazed as we were with their creativity and appreciate all of the hard work that the children have put into the designs.

#### English


This week we have enjoyed sharing our own stories with each other to give constructive feedback. Our challenge at the end of the week was to ensure our responses to texts were as detailed as possible.

#### Maths

This week we have recognised what we can learn from graphs which we have created. We will be asking and answering questions about discrete data.

Next week we will be finishing our term with an arithmetic focus. We have covered a variety of methods during this first term and next week will give us the opportunity to recognise how to apply the 'best' method to solve the various problems we can be presented with.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

The speed of children's recall is going to be really important next week. Over the weekend, play some quick-fire maths games with each other. Ask them questions, ask them to ask you questions (do they know the correct answers!)






#### **Maths**

In maths this week we have been looking at statistics. We have worked really hard on presenting the data in pictograms and bar charts. We have found it fun to collect the data within the class and collate it into a tally chart before presenting it in a graph.

Next week, we will be focusing on Roman Numerals and being able to recognise and use them in our work. We will also begin learning about time and be able to tell the time on analogue and digital.



#### **English**

This week in English we have been planning our story about the Ancient Egyptians. On Friday, we will be using the concepts we have learnt throughout the week, including speech, expanded noun phrases and paragraphs to write fantastic creative stories.

Next week we will be focusing on articulating and justifying answers, arguments and opinions. Our learning objectives throughout the week will include:

Can I appropriately discuss with others my opinions and thoughts?

Can I sort sentences into facts and opinions and justify my reasons?

Can I use a visual source to articulate and justify my answers, arguments and opinions?

Can I write my opinions, arguments and answers on a given topic?

Children should now know their times tables and related division facts up to 8x12. Can you continue to ensure your child can recall these quickly and correctly. The children are working hard on this.

#### **Design and Technology**

This week we recapped cam mechanisms and started to plan our toy cars. We looked at different cam movements and which would be most suitable for our design. We had to sketch a cam and follower; then design our cars with moving components. Some of us came up with some crazy, complex ideas of panoramic roofs, suicide doors and a flapping hood. It will be rather intriguing to see how these initial ideas come to life next week.

#### Maths

This week, we have been learning about measurement. We have been learning to:

- Can I multiply and divide by 10,100 and 1000?
- Can I read divisions for measure with whole numbers?
- Can I read divisions for measure with decimal numbers?
- Can I use scaling with appropriate numbers?
   Can I use all four operations to solve problems involving measures?

Next week, we will have some Christmas themed maths lessons, problem solving and helping Santa workout his numbers correctly.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths:

Learners should now know their times tables and related division facts up to 12 x12. Can you continue to ensure your child can recall these quickly and correctly? The learners are working hard on this and we have seen some great progress so far!

- support their comprehension of what they read through helping them to infer information from a range of texts and justify their viewpoint with substantiating evidence.

This week, Year 6:

 Calculated, estimated and compared volume of cubes and cuboids using standard units, including cubic centimetres (cm3) and cubic metres (m3), and extending to other units [for example, mm3 and km3].

Next week Y6 will be:

 Recognising and describing linear number sequences including fractions and decimals and finding term to term rule in words
